This presentation will unpack the data from the 2020 NRVC/CARA Study on Recent Vocations by reflecting on how our words and actions promote or inhibit a culture of vocations.

Ignatian Spiritual Exercises and Spiritual Direction Certificate Training Program thru SIF Seminars in Ignatian Formation (SIF) applications are now being taken for SIF. SIF: Seminar 1 and SIF: Seminar 2, September, 2020 – May, 2021. Application link: Jesuitsmidwest.org/SIF-Info.

SIF commenced in the Fall of 2019 as three annual Ignatian Seminars, running simultaneously, sponsored by the UMI/Midwest Province of Jesuits. Seminar 1: theological-biblical foundations for Christian mission and spiritual direction (those with theology background are given a "bye"). Seminar 2: the principles of spiritual direction; begin study of the text of the Exercises; Ignatian discernment of spirits; contemplative listening skills. Seminar 3: supervised internship giving the complete Spiritual Exercises of Ignatius of Loyola. Seminar 1: 14 classes, alternating Thursday evening and Saturday morning, every other week, September through early May. Seminar 2: 9 Saturday classes over 9 months, September through early May.
