Religious Brothers Symposium: Saturday, April 4, 2020 at Boston College at the Crowne Plaza-Boston Newton*

The theme for this second gathering of religious brothers is "The sky's the limit," and appropriately enough, the keynote presenter will be Brother Guy Consolmagno, SJ, the director of the Vatican Observatory who will discuss "The Prophetic Call of the Brother in the Church." Invited presenters from around the world will discuss how brothers are living witnesses of the prophetic Gospel call. Small-group sessions in the afternoon will allow for discussion. Cardinal Sean O'Malley, OFM Capuchin, Archbishop of Boston, will celebrate the closing Mass. Registration will open at 8 a.m. on Saturday, April 4, with the program beginning at 9 a.m. Lunch will be provided, and the day will conclude with the Eucharistic Liturgy at 5:30 p.m. On Friday, April 3, there will be an optional bus tour to Spencer Abbey. On Sunday, April 5 there will be a breakfast at the Crowne-Plaza-Boston Newton. The Brothers Think Tank will lead a conversation at breakfast discussing what was heard and how best it can be applied. The morning program will end at 11 a.m.
